**Antisocial Behaviour**

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including drunken behaviour.

There were no calls relating to public disorder or any other type of anti-social behaviour.

**Road Safety**

Last night, a vehicle was stopped by Police and the driver has been charged with drunk driving. . He appears at court today (21/1).

Speed checks have been carried out in Station Road and Beech Road, with nothing of note found.

**Theft**

You are concerned about homes being broken into and travelling criminals.

One person was charged with a low value theft by shoplifting in Killearn. No other crimes were reported.

**Community Engagement and Reassurance**

It is important to you to have community officers who you know, who are accessible and who address local problems.

There was an increase in officer patrols, focusing on vehicle defects, drink driving and checking drivers to identify travelling criminals.
