**Ward Plan Priorities**

**Antisocial Behaviour**

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including drunken behaviour.

There was one instance of public disorder. One person was charged and will receive a Formal Adult Warning.

**Road Safety**

You are concerned about speeding, dangerous driving and indiscriminate parking

A local man was caught drink driving on 20 Jan and kept in custody because the alcohol reading was high. He pled guilty and was disqualified. The court is considering seizing the car for destruction.

There was one collision at the Dumgoyne junction. No one was injured.

**Theft**

You are concerned about homes being broken into and travelling criminals.

A vehicle was broken into at a farm outside Killearn and a handbag stolen. We would remind residents not to leave valuables on open display in vehicles.

A shoplifting is being investigated at the CoOp.

**Community Engagement and Reassurance**

It is important to you to have community officers who you know, who are accessible and who address local problems.

We are working as part of a national initiative 'Operation Quarterlight' aimed at tackling vehicle crime. We have been carrying out static vehicle checks to deter and identify travelling criminals
