Ward Plan Priorities

Antisocial Behaviour

Not long after last month's CC meeting more reports of egg throwing at houses occurred for a couple of nights. The children who we thought were doing this were spoken to and advised regarding carrying out these actions. Although it is not confirmed it was them, the incidents have ceased.

On 28th January 2017 there was a report of youths from a birthday party from within the village hall causing a disturbance in the surrounding streets after the party had ended. Area was monitored by Police and apart from a bit of noise, there was no real issues.

Road Safety

Complaints have been received again regarding drivers inconsiderately parking in the vicinity of the Primary School. This is regularly monitored and will continue to be so. On 25th January 2017 a driver was caught parking on the yellow zig zags while waiting for her kids to come out of the school. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

Complaints have been received from residents re speeding in the village. This will continue to be monitored and speed checks carried out. Recently 2 drivers have been issued with Conditional Offer of Fixed Penalties in relation to speeding.

On 17th January 2017 a male was caught and arrested for driving while under the influence of alcohol.

On 29th January 2017 a one vehicle RTC occurred on the A81 near to the distillery. The driver struck a telegraph pole causing damage but fortunately did he not suffer any injury.

Theft

Between 8am and 6.15pm on 19th January 2017 a house was broken into at Elder Road, Killearn. The perpetrators gained access by forcing a rear patio door and ransacking the house, stealing mostly electrical equipment and jewellery.

Enquiries are still ongoing however anyone with any information is urged to contact the Police.
