Ward Plan Priorities

### **Antisocial Behaviour**

On the evening of 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2017, police received a complaint about loud music being played from a residential property in Crosshead Road. Police attended and advice and assistance was given.

Over the past few weeks, concerns have been raised about youths gathering in the playground of Killearn Primary School in the evening whilst drinking alcohol and discarding litter. Local officers will continue to carry out proactive patrols in the area, however if local residents observe anyone causing damage or annoyance in the area, they are urged to contact Police Scotland.

### **Road Safety**

Over the reporting period, there were four recorded road traffic collisions in the Killearn area. Three of the collisions involved one vehicle, and they occurred on the A875, the A81 and the B834. The other collision involved two vehicles, and occurred on the B834. No injuries were sustained in any of the collisions, with damage being caused to the narrow bridge on the B834 as a result of one of the collisions.

Police patrols have continued around Killearn Primary School at school time in response to complaints about inconsiderate and illegal parking, and we will continue to carry out such patrols.

Further speed checks have been carried out in the village, and two motorists have been issued with a Conditional Offer of Fixed Penalty for speeding offences. Following the recent concerns raised about vehicles travelling at excess speed on the A875 near to Branziert Road North, speed checks have also been conducted there.

#### **Theft**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2017, a quantity of alcohol was stolen from the Co-op in Killearn. Police enquiry subsequently identified the man responsible, and he was the subject of a report to the Procurator Fiscal.
