	Incidents of note There were no incidents of note.

GARGUNNOCK	Road Traffic
	Enquiries are ongoing to trace the driver of a company van, which collided with a parked car. The driver of the van left the scene without exchanging details or reporting the matter. No injuries were reported however the collision did cause damage to the parked car.
	Incidents of note A report was received of a one vehicle road traffic collision which occurred at the junction of Mains Farm and the A811. The vehicle left the road and slid into a ditch. The female driver was checked over by ambulance as a precaution but thankfully was uninjured.

KILLEARN	Fraud
	A fraud has been recorded after the reporter received a phone call from a person purporting to be from the reporter's bank. During the call, the reporter was advised, in order to prevent 2 x 5 figure transactions being imminently debited from her account she would have to reverse the transactions. The reporter was provided with the bank account details in order to do so. On sending the first 5 figure payment the reporter immediately became suspicious and terminated the call. The reporter contacted her bank, who are investigating the matter. Police enquiries are ongoing to identify a suspect.

KIPPEN	Road Traffic
	Police were contacted to report an incident of dangerous driving on the A811. A silver Volkswagen Golf was observed by the reporter to be swerving on to the opposing carriageway, driving erratically and driving in the middle of the road despite there being oncoming traffic. Dashcam has been retained, and enquiries are ongoing to identify the driver.
	Incidents of note There were no incidents of note.

STRATHBLANE	Assault
	A male has been reported to the court following an incident whereby he assaulted two people. One victim was bitten and thereafter admitted to hospital for treatment. The other victim was uninjured having been tackled to the ground by the suspect.
	Vandalism
	Police were contacted following damage which was caused to a wooden hut which houses an old water tank located on the roof of Strathblane Primary School. It has been reported that youths have regularly been observed on the roof of the school. Enquiries are ongoing to identify those responsible.
	Road Traffic
	A report was received following a collision between two vehicles on the A81. While the reporter stopped his vehicle, the driver of the other vehicle left the scene without exchanging details or reporting the matter. No injuries were reported however the

Two motorists were warned in regard to their speed. - A number of reports have been received in regard to poaching and persons fishing in no fishing zones in several different locations. The local wildlife and community officers are aware for patrols in the area. - A report was received in regard to sheep worrying in a field near to Mugdock Country Park. Officers attended and spoke to the farmer who confirmed no sheep had been injured. The dog and dog's owner had left prior to officers attending.
